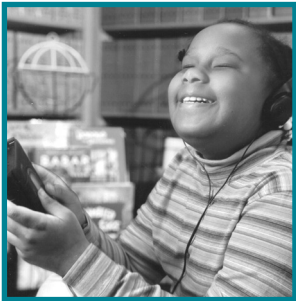

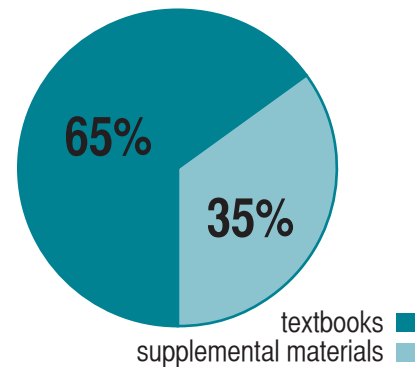

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Our research* shows that when students with print and learning disabilities use audio textbooks they:

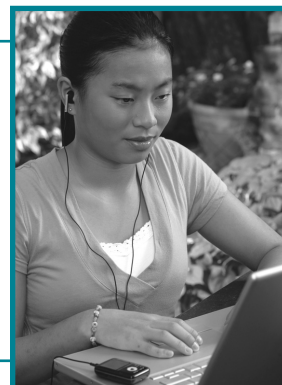
Improve reading comprehension (76%)

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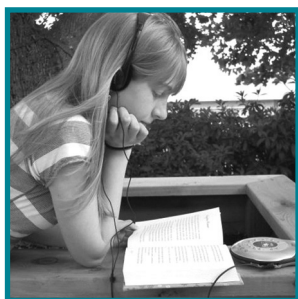
